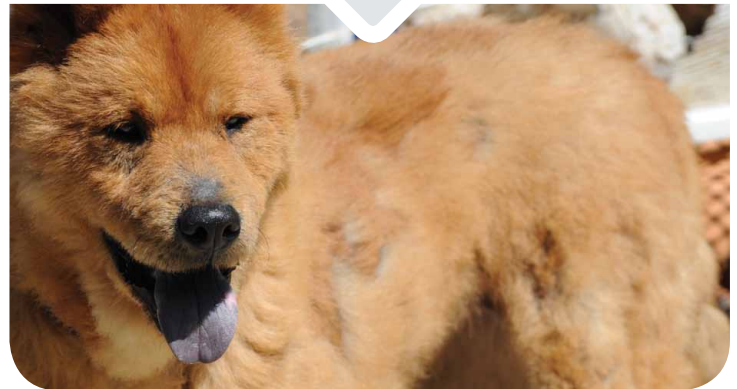


Dog with Wounds and Sores from Mange*
